

## **Welcome to the Spring News Letter**

For many people spring is the best time of the year the promise of new growth and greenery in the garden. Jubilee Gardens are no exception and as I write the wisteria is in full bloom, there are new leaves and blossom on the trees and the English bluebells we planted last autumn in the Queens Wood are flowering beautifully, providing us with a vibrant

display of colour.



Unfortunately, however the gardens were subject to some criminal damage on 15<sup>th</sup> March. An apple tree sapling was destroyed, the Tibetan cherry tree was partially uprooted and several branches broken from trees elsewhere. Fortunately the Friends were able to step in and provide a new apple tree and also a replacement for the "wedding cake tree" in the Queen's Wood which wasn't thriving. These were planted at the first "working party "of the year on 21<sup>st</sup> March. Elsewhere in this newsletter you can catch up on some of the other news.

**Working Parties:** These recommenced on 21<sup>st</sup> March, a week late due to an adverse weather forecast for 14<sup>th</sup> March. Two new trees were planted and a start made to tidying up the various beds. There's plenty more to keep us busy though in the coming months. Working parties take place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of each month. We are however aiming to hold a couple on Saturdays, probably 8<sup>th</sup> June and 22<sup>nd</sup> June. The Saturday working party we held in the autumn to plant bluebells was well attended and gives an opportunity for members and their families who are otherwise busy on Thursdays to attend. We are hoping to plant some bedding plants on these occasions. All members are welcome to attend all working parties.

## **Forthcoming Events:**

- Etheldreda Fair: Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> June. Last year we had a very successful stall on Palace Green and recruited numerous new members and sold a large number of plants to the public, the proceeds going to the Friends to spend on the Gardens. Last year the stall was manned by the committee members on a rota throughout the day. This year not all committee members can be present and it would be helpful if a few members could participate in a rota and perhaps man the stall for an hour or so on the day. Volunteers welcome!
- Summer Tea Party: Last year this was very enjoyable and successful and was held at Jane Blanchard's home. This year we have not yet fixed a date and venue but we do anticipate holding the event.

# **Summer Outing**

### Membership

## **Future Projects**

Some of the projects discussed previously have not yet happened. These include improvements and refurbishments to the Dry Garden and the Sensory Garden.

Some old lavender has been removed from the Dry Garden but there is still much to be done. Unfortunately the council is, as ever, short of resources and have increasing responsibilities elsewhere and personnel are more thinly spread than ever. We on the committee

will continue to try and keep a focus on Jubilee Gardens and attempt to ensure that even if things happen slowly they still happen.

**Signage**: Most people will have noticed the new sign at the Queen's Wood which has been in place for some time now and has attracted favourable comment for its educational content and its physical robustness. The aim is to have similar signs at the Winter Garden and Dry Garden. The crumbling sign at the former met its final end at the hands of the vandals in March!

#### **Other Events**

As usual the gardens will play host to some other events

- Band concerts commence the 12<sup>th</sup> May with the Kings Lynn Town Band and continue on Sundays finishing on 1<sup>st</sup> September with Waterbeach Brass.
- Ely's Eel Festival begins this Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May and lasts the whole of bank holiday weekend. The Eel Parade is on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May and begins at 10.30 at Cross Green and terminates in the Gardens.
- Ely Aquafest is on 7<sup>th</sup> July this year.
- Pride in Ely festival will happen on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> August
- The Monster Triathlon is scheduled for Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August
